

- **Primary Care:** access centres, provincial & federal government clinics, mobile clinic, private practice, Quickcare, self-employed, virtual care
- Long Term Care: home care, care homes, Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD), palliative care
- **Hospitals:** acute care, emergency, maternity, neonatal intensive care, NP-Led Hospital (Swan Lake, MB), paediatrics, urgent care
- **Self-Employed Business:** family practice, fertility, functional medicine, home health care, hormone therapy, medical aesthetics, primary care
- **Specialty Areas:** addictions, cancer care, cannabis, fertility, heart failure, HIV, perinatal mental health, psychiatry, RAAM clinics, transgender health
- **Other:** education, corrections health, First Nations health clinics, governance, management, military clinics, nursing stations, research, secondary schools, teen clinics, travel agencies, virtual care

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
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What is a Nurse Practitioner?

A Nurse Practitioner (NP) is a registered nurse who has completed advanced education at a master's or PhD level. They are completely independent health professionals and require no outside supervision of their practice.

Nurse Practitioners practice includes the legal authority to:

- Perform comprehensive health
 assessments and manage a panel of patients
- Diagnose & treat acute or chronic illness or injuries
- Prescribe medications, controlled substances & medical supplies
- Perform minor surgical procedures such as suturing, biopsies & IUD insertion
- Make referrals to other health care professionals such as specialists
- Order, conduct and interpret diagnostic tests (ie. lab, Xray, CT, MRI)
- Admit and discharge to long-term care facilities and some hospitals

PROVIDING PROFESSIONAL HEALTH CARE

Your NP focuses on whole health. They will take time during appointments to listen to your health concerns, address your health care needs and provide you with the professional direction you require to live your healthiest life.

DO I NEED A FAMILY

Nurse Practitioners are independent health professionals who can perform a wide range of services and treatments, very similar to the care that a family doctor provides, and require no outside supervision for their practice.

If there are complex health problems or something beyond the knowledge, skills or abilities of your Nurse Practitioner, they have a responsibility to ensure that the appropriate specialist or health care provider is consulted. In other care models, the Nurse Practitioner may care for a patient in a care team including a physician and/or other health care professionals.

There is no reason that a Nurse Practitioner cannot be an individual's primary care provider.
